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6 STEPS TO MOVIE FUNDRAISER SUCCESS

Use this step-by-step framework to plan an event that runs smoothly and hits your fundraising goals.

STEP 1. CHOOSE THE RIGHT MOVIE

Crowd-pleasing, family-friendly hits tend to draw the biggest turnout. Want a shortcut? Visit page 6 for this year's top picks or use [our website](#) to search by theme, genre or season. Just don't forget to double-check the rating to ensure the film fits your audience.

STEP 2. SECURE YOUR PUBLIC PERFORMANCE LICENSE

Don't skip this step! To show a movie at school (even a free event), you must obtain a public performance license for copyright compliance. Swank's license is the only way to legally show major Hollywood films in public K-12 settings. If your school doesn't already have a license, reach out to Swank to get one in place before your event.

This license also allows you to promote the movie title and fundraise for your school, helping you maximize turnout and fundraising. See page 7 for more details on licensing and how to protect your school.

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STEP 3. LOCK DOWN VOLUNTEERS AND FUNDRAISING STRATEGY

Movie nights are refreshingly low-lift. Aim for 5 to 10 volunteers total to help with setup, concessions, ticket-taking and cleanup. Teachers, parents and even older students can all pitch in. Assign clear roles ahead of time to keep things running smoothly. Decide on your fundraising approach early, whether through concession sales, donation-based entry, raffles or community sponsorships. Choose the option that works best for your school and gather the resources you need to support it.

STEP 4. PROMOTE THE EVENT

The more visibility, the bigger the crowd! Start promoting at least six weeks in advance using these channels:

- **Backpack Flyers:** Include all the event details.
- **Posters Around Campus:** Place in hallways, lobbies and pickup/drop-off areas.
- **Morning Announcements:** Use your student news or principal to generate excitement.
- **School Communications:** Add to your website, email newsletters and community calendars.
- **School Social Media Accounts:** Create a Facebook event or post in your parent organization group – encourage sharing!

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STEP 5. PICK THE VENUE AND PREP THE TECH

Choose your screening location – gym, cafeteria, auditorium or outdoors.

Secure a projector, speakers and screen (or blank wall) early, and always do a test run in the actual space a few days before the event.

Plan seating that suits your space – chairs, mats or a BYO-blanket setup – and have trash bins ready for easy cleanup.

STEP 6. WRAP UP AND PLAN WHAT'S NEXT

After the movie, thank your volunteers and audience. If you know how much you raised, announce it! Then, ride the momentum by asking families to vote on the next movie, or set a date for your next screening.

With a Swank site license, you're covered to host these events year-round – for clubs, parent organizations, reward days and more. The possibilities are endless, and each event builds more community support (and funds) for your school.

CREATIVE WAYS TO ELEVATE YOUR MOVIE NIGHT

Once you have the basics down, consider layering in some creative touches to elevate your movie night from ordinary to extraordinary. Here are a few ideas seasoned parent organizations have used to boost engagement and fun (and sometimes revenue) at school movie events:



Themed Dress-Up or Decor: Match your movie with a theme! Screening a superhero movie? Make it a “Superhero Night” and encourage everyone to wear capes. You can decorate the venue to match the theme (have the art club paint some posters or props) for extra flair. Themed nights get students excited and create great photo ops.

Pre-Show Performances or Activities: Kick off the event with a quick performance. Invite the choir or band for a “preview,” or have the drama club do a skit or trivia game. These touches get students involved and make the event feel like a mini festival.



Craft and Game Stations: Especially for elementary audiences, a simple craft or game can keep kids busy as families arrive or during intermission. You could also have a movie-themed quiz or trivia game (with small prizes for winners) before the show.

Raffles, Contests and Prizes: Raise extra funds with raffles or contests. Offer prizes like themed baskets, VIP seats or spirit wear. Run a “Best Costume” contest to tie in with your theme and boost engagement.

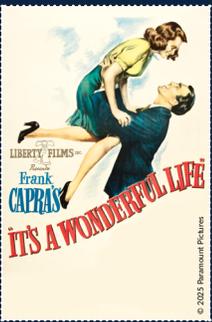
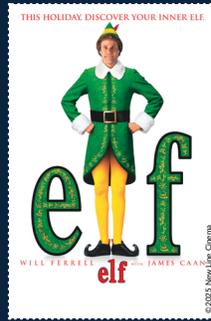
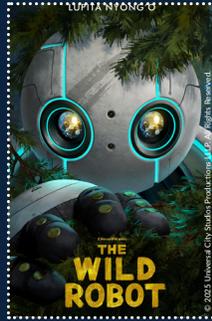


Community & Club Tie-Ins: Team up with student groups! The art club can decorate, the culinary class can bake and student council can host games. These partnerships lighten your load and increase attendance by bringing in families from those groups.

Concession Upgrades: Go beyond popcorn. Theme a snack to the movie, or invite a food truck or local vendor to sell treats and donate a portion. Bundle items into a “Meal Deal” (pizza, drink and popcorn) to boost your fundraiser.
